### LIBRARY COMMISSION MINUTES Regular Meeting October 15, 2024

#### 1) Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:04 p.m. by Chair Laney.

#### 2) Roll Call

#### 3) Approval of Minutes

#### 4) Business from the Floor

#### 5) Reports and Presentations

#### a. Monthly Statistics:

• Library Director Thomas Gruneisen reported on the September Statistics. It's still early in the fiscal year, but the trends we are watching include:

- (1) We continue to see an increase in the use of electronic materials (books and audiobooks). This month, eMaterial usage is up 13% compared to the preceding year, whereas our consortium's purchase of new eMaterials is down 54%. We expect this trend to continue as our consortium received significantly reduced funding from the State Library this year, potentially impacting eResource circulation.
- (2) Adult volunteer hours are up 16% compared to the preceding year. We expect this to continue as we incorporate volunteers more widely into our workflows.
- (3) In a regular annual occurrence, September circulation dropped significantly compared to August, marking the close of summer vacation. However, the decrease this year was deeper than last year's reduction, which is something we'll be monitoring in the months ahead.

Library Director Thomas Gruneisen responded to comments and questions from the Library Commission.

#### 6) Library Director's Report

Library Director Thomas Gruneisen reported on the following:

- The UC Master Gardeners presented a program on learning to compost with earthworms on Saturday, October 19<sup>th</sup>.
- Community Service Day was on September 21<sup>st</sup>. Volunteers gave the Library a deep cleaning; a volunteer led a successful toy drive for hospitalized youth; and people wrote cards to support active duty military personnel.
- On October 9, the League of Women Voters delivered a nonpartisan overview of the ten statewide propositions on California's November ballot.
- The Library is now serving as a Ballot Drop Box location through Election Day on Tuesday, November 5<sup>th</sup>.
- We have resumed our fall Make-It Program, a STEM-themed program for school-aged youth.
- Our community continues to show their appreciation for the Library through their generous support. This morning the Library received a \$100 donation from the MG Car show. Earlier in the month, the Library received a \$3,000 donation from Renaissance Productions, which organizes the annual Renaissance Faire. We are appreciative of their generosity, as well as that of the Friends of the Library, who staffed a successful book sale at the event.
- Facility repairs in the Youth Wing continue. This phase of the interior work
  has been completed, and exterior work will begin once a subcontractor has
  been selected.
- The City presented three Town Hall Meetings to update the community on the state of the City's budget, with one of the meetings being presented here

inside the Library. One meeting was held virtually, and the other at Mangini Ranch Elementary School.

- Commissioner Jonnalagadda would like to invite The Friends of the Library to discuss ideas for raising funds for the library.

Chair Laney commented that the library calendar is well organized and well put together. It is highlighted effectively and is very readable.


